



Opens May 2010 with new Chez Roux restaurant

Designed by Edwardian architect Sir Edwin Lutyens in 1901, Greywalls hotel has stayed true to its roots and today retains the original classical style for which it is renowned. Surrounded by golf courses, the house offers 23 en suite bedrooms, warm and inviting public areas including a dedicated whisky room and traditional style library, elegant walled gardens, two tennis courts, a putting green and a croquet lawn. Greywalls boasts twelve golf courses within five miles, which include; Gullane, Luffness, North Berwick, The Renaissance and Archerfield.

Celebrated Michelin starred chef Albert Roux is also launching his *Chez Roux* restaurant at Greywalls this May. Serving 'French classical cuisine with a flair and lightness, using local product as much as possible', Chez Roux will serve delights such as *Scottish Lobster Tail with Verveina and Apricots* and *Lobster Vermouth Jus*. The delicious dishes will be enjoyed in the hotel's dining room, overlooking the 10th tee at Muirfield.
